Today's readings find meaning and strength in Saint John's texts. The main rule that calls the disciples to Christ is undoubtedly the commandment to love. Those who love give their lives for others, as Jesus did; those who do not love do not know God, because God is love. This fount of new life—love—compelled Peter to open the gates of the community to all the foreigners who believed in God, Cornelius and the gentiles. The bond of communion in the risen Jesus that both Peter and Paul share sent them forth to announce the Gospel to all who

wanted to hear it. Today's readings motivate us to reflect on the theme of the Father's unconditional love, through his Son and in the Holy Spirit, in both the texts prepared for the celebration of the liturgy and also visually, in the environment. In the diversity of the assembly gathered for worship we can discern the unity in the Spirit that brought them together.



Liturgy of the Word

ACTS

Chapter 10

Verses 25-26, 34-35, 44-48 When Peter entered, Cornelius met him and, falling at his feet, paid him homage. Peter, however, raised him up, saying, "Get up. I myself am also a human being."

Then Peter proceeded to speak and said, "In truth, I see that God shows no partiality. Rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him."

While Peter was still speaking these things, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who were listening to the word. The circumcised believers who had accompanied Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit should have been poured out on the Gentiles also, for they could hear them speaking in tongues and glorifying God. Then Peter responded, "Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people, who have received the Holy Spirit even as we have?" He ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ.



Chapter 4


Verses 7-10

Jesus said to his disciples:

"As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love.

"I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy might be complete. This is my commandment: love one another as I love you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I no longer call you slaves, because a slave does not know what his master is doing. I have called you friends, because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father. It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name he may give you. This I command you: love one another."

Homily


Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.
