Building a Culture of Life

Last week the Supreme Court of the United States issued a historic ruling in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization, overturning Roe v. Wade and returning the issue of abortion to the citizens and voters of each state.

No issue in our lifetime has been more polarizing or divisive than this. It's important, then, for us to begin by simply stating what we believe and why it matters. The protection of human life is not just another issue; it is the cornerstone of the church's whole social teaching, that all human life is sacred from the moment of conception to natural death. We also believe that it is important to surround people facing difficult circumstances with love, care, and the services they need, so that every life, at every stage, can flourish.

Today is a day of gratitude to God that innocent lives that otherwise would have been lost will now be saved. This does not end this issue but marks the beginning of a new chapter.

The issue of abortion will now move to the various states and state legislatures, who will be answerable to the people. Our voices and votes will truly matter. Yet even beyond new laws and regulations, there is more we are called to do.

In his encyclical, "The Gospel of Life," Pope John Paul II affirmed the commitment of the Church to protect the vulnerable and defend innocent life, that in the face of a "Culture of Death" that includes abortion, we need to promote a "Culture of Life." He challenged people of faith to provide support, healing, and compassion. These things matter. Many women, including people you may know, sometimes members of our own families, and even members of our church, have faced this awful choice. We are not here to condemn. We know that compassion will do more to heal than harsh words or judgment.

As a result of this ruling, more children will be born, and issues that have been in the background will take on increasing urgency: like maternal leave and health care, protections for women from predators and violence, public and private measures to support mothers and children, especially the poor, are all part of a Culture of Life. It will demand more of us as Catholics and as a nation. The Bishops of the United States have called on our country to prioritize the well-being of women, children and families with the resources and support they need, so that no woman will ever feel forced to choose between her future and the life of her child. We all have a share in this work.

Today let us pray in gratitude for this important victory, for the thousands of children who will now live, for the millions who have died, for mothers who are struggling, and for our nation, that animosity will end, and human life can flourish.

What is the Biblical Basis for Stephen Ministry



Stephen Ministry draws its name from the book of Acts. In chapter 6, Stephen was chosen to provide

caring ministry to those in need. Caring ministry has been a feature of the Christian faith throughout history – and it is at the heart of what Stephen Ministers do.

Stephen Ministry serves to bring Christ's healing love to those who are hurt. Jesus instructed his disciples to "love one another as I have loved you" (John 13:34). Stephen Ministry, as a care-giving ministry, equips people to offer that love through their caring presence, listening, encouraging, and praying with their care receivers.

One of the Spiritual Works of Mercy, Comforting the Sorrowful, describes Stephen Ministry's work well. The United Conference of Catholic Bishops describes this work as, "a listening ear to those going through a tough time."


