

Welcome to Holy Martyrs Catholic Church *April 21st, 2024* 4th Sunday of Easter

This Easter season the readings have been similar to each other in that they reveal the presence of the risen Lord in the life of the Church. The reading from the Acts of the Apostles today shares Peter's testimony before the Jews, who cannot understand the relationship Jesus has with his followers. In the second reading, Saint John affirms the Father's love for

each of us through his Son; this makes us all his children. Today's Gospel does not tell of another of Jesus' encounters with his disciples but, instead, invites us to understand the intimacy we each have with the Lord. We don't need to recognize the Lord; he knows us all just like the shepherd knows and loves his sheep. This Good Shepherd Sunday should foster a better understanding of our relationship with the Lord. We should pray for our spiritual shepherds and see in them God's love for us; this will help them continue to honor the responsibilities God has entrusted them with.



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




ACTS Chapter 4 Verses 8-12

JOHN Chapter 10 Verses: 11-18

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John. **Glory to you, O Lord** Jesus said:

"I am the good shepherd. A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. A hired man, who is not a shepherd and whose sheep are not his own, sees a wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away, and the wolf catches and scatters them. This is because he works for pay and has no concern for the sheep. I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I will lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. These also I must lead, and they will hear my voice, and there will be one flock, one shepherd. This is why the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down on my own. I have power to lay it down, and power to take it up again. This command I have received from my Father."





People: Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.


A prayer for all unable to physically be here today.
