You may also bring your own lawn chair to sit on during Mass.


For ease of access, you should plan to park in the back parking lot.

### Stephen Ministry

#### What Is Stephen Ministry?

Stephen Ministry is a complete system for training and organizing laypeople to provide one-to-one care to hurting people in the Holy Martyrs congregation and in the community. There are 3 main groups of people involved in Stephen Ministry:

- **Stephen Leaders** are lay leaders and church staff trained by Stephen Ministries St. Louis to direct Holy Martyrs' Stephen Ministry.
- **Stephen Ministers** are lay Holy Martyrs members specially trained by their Stephen Leaders to provide high-quality Christian care to hurting individuals.
- Care Receivers are people who meet with a Stephen Minister to receive care while experiencing a difficult time in life. After being matched with a person experiencing a life crisis, the Stephen Minister meets with that person on a weekly basis to listen, care, encourage and provide emotional and spiritual support. The caring relationship lasts as long as the need for care exists. A Stephen Minister will meet with you privately by phone, by video chat, or, if safely possible, in person.

The name Stephen Ministry comes from St. Stephen, one of the first laypeople commissioned by the Apostles to provide caring ministry to those in need (Acts 6:1-7).

If you or someone you know is struggling with challenges like...

- Isolation and Ioneliness
- Anxiety over health
- Grief due to losses
- Tension from juggling work, childcare and schooling
- Financial strain or job loss
- · Uncertainty about the future
- Other unexpected life challenges



You don't have to face it alone. Our Stephen Ministers are ready to listen, care, encourage and provide emotional and spiritual support.

### Protecting God's Children

### Protecting God's Children

For three weeks every January, HMKids and Spirit students in grades 1-8 learn skills that help them protect themselves from child molesters. Children are taught how to recognize boundary violations that precede abuse, remove themselves from uncomfortable situations and tell a trusted adult when someone has crossed a boundary.

**Praesidium** developed a curriculum with ageappropriate lessons for each grade level.

- Second graders will learn about listening to their "gut" or intuition when it tells them something's not right.
- Third graders will learn about different types
  of secrets and how to recognize a "bad"
  secret. They'll also learn what to say to a
  trusted adult when someone has asked them
  to keep a secret that makes them feel unsafe.
- An important part of what fifth graders learn relates to limiting private information shared online.

The Diocese of Cleveland requires that these skills be taught every year to children in grades 1-8. **SPIRIT** students (grades 7 and 8) will receive this training in January as well.

This training for children is the "other arm of **Virtus**", which educates adults about what to watch for when they see adults interacting with children.

**VIRTUS** has always championed taking measures to ensure that children are safer in person, and online. In addition, **WePROTECT** has echoed these steps, and provided additional ones,<sup>5</sup> in order to provide the best possible opportunity to protect children during this time.

## How do I actually report or communicate my concerns?

- If you are aware of an adult exhibiting behavior that is against the code of conduct or an organization's policy: speak to a supervisor. Keep communicating "up the chain" of command until your concerns are addressed.
- If you are aware that a child is, or could be, in immediate danger: call 911.
- For a suspicion or knowledge of abuse, including if a child discloses directly or indirectly: call the child abuse hotline (for Child Protective Services) for the county or the state, or local law enforcement.

For possible exploitation via technology: If you suspect that a child is being groomed or exploited via technology (online, gaming, cell phones, social media, etc.), communicate your concerns via the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children's tip line, at <a href="https://www.cybertipline.com">www.cybertipline.com</a>.

For possible abuse within your employee or volunteer organization: If you suspect or know a child is being, or has been abused, by a diocesan employee or volunteer, *first* call the child abuse hotline for your state, and *then* notify the diocese immediately (typically through the safe environment or child protection office).

Block and report anyone that makes the youth, or you, uncomfortable. You should report any exploitative online material to:

You can also report directly in the app or website for elements that are against the policy.
