are on heaven is something else. God invites us to walk next to the just who are free, even though they may be rejected or feel oppressed at times. There is no need to fight to be first among many, as the apostles discussed in today's Gospel did. Jesus shows us the path of service and knows that peace is born out of the fruits of justice. Can we name those in our society who lean most toward avarice? Who are those who embrace justice and compassion because they know it is the Lord who helps them?




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

The wicked say:







As part of the Eucharistic prayer, we acclaim our faith together.


